

Hazing Prevention Coalition: Educational Scaffolding



Tier 4: Will focus on dynamics of power and privilege (building off of ethical decision making)

- a. Students transitioning to live in off campus housing will need to complete an educational requirement
- b. Students undergoing a conduct process for, or related to, hazing will need to complete educational requirements



Tier 3: Will focus on pro-health behaviors that prevent and are alternatives to hazing

- a. All Sophomores required to engage in content about ethical decision making
- b. Required staff education that provides tools for engaging with students about hazing



Tier 2: Will focus on student populations known to be at higher risk for experiencing and/or perpetuating hazing (each must be unique because of overlap in the populations)

- a. Annual required education for all greek and program house new and returning leaders
- b. Annual required education for all recognized student groups (one member from group leadership)
- c. Annual required education for all student athletes



Tier 1: Will focus on educational requirements for all incoming undergraduate students (possibly all students in the 1st year of implementation) that includes:

- a. Shared terms, definitions, and examples of hazing
- b. Policy
- c. How to report hazing
